Safety Update *Cyclosporiasis Outbreak Update*

On August 6, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) ended their recommendation to avoid eating bagged salad mixes as new cyclosporiasis case reports and related emergency department visits are on the decline. - **OSI Launches Community Conversation on Offsets:** OSI just launched a multi-month engagement process around carbon offsets – a key component of meeting the community's 2030 carbon neutrality goals. A new Engage Ann Arbor page, a public website, public input survey, and a series of public meetings were announced as part of the launch of this multi-month engagement effort. - **Solar Keeps Expanding at City Facilities:** Did you know that a solar system recently was installed at Bicentennial Park, along with electric vehicle chargers? And work is underway to finalize solar systems at City Hall/Justice Center, Fire Station 1, and Fire Station 3! These systems are part of OSI's work to help make City facilities more sustainable.

This hands-on work helps keep the play area cleaner, safer, and more welcoming for children, families, and neighbors who visit the park throughout the season.
