A MESSAGE FROM MAYOR AMY WILCZYNSKI

I hope everyone is getting settled back into their routines after the summer. We have had a very busy September in the borough. I hope many were able to attend our beautiful 9/11 ceremony. It's a very special evening that I have been a part of for over 10 years. This year we had many of our local veterans participate as well local singers and musicians, including Clan Na Vale. The ceremony was videotaped so I will be sure to share soon!

We have completed **infrastructure improvements** this month including sidewalk repair on Hillside and West Orchard. Also, the new pavers in Memorial Park are finished: they came out beautifully, so please be sure to visit. Bids were just received to pave roads as part of our 2026 paving program (Cedar, Crescent Pl, Cebak Ct. and Oakwood). We are also gearing up to rehabilitate the entire **transit lot parking lot**. This lot will be completely overhauled with new paving, striping and signage. We have had to collaborate with NJ Transit on this project.

At our **public safety** meeting this week, we discussed the alarming increase in number of cars and trucks on our roads, including excessive speed and distracted driving. I understand this is an important concern for residents. One of our officers said it's an extreme increase from just a few years ago. Our police have been actively enforcing speeding, and we are looking at this from multiple angles. One important initiative that we are implementing is hiring a traffic engineer to amend our master plan with a **Traffic and Transportation component**. This is a comprehensive evaluation of Allendale's transportation network, including vehicle traffic, pedestrian and bicycle circulation, parking, intersections, sidewalks, crosswalks, crossing guards and overall traffic safety. This will include a **Complete Streets Policy** which will gather resident input on traffic concerns and opportunities for improvement because no one knows our town better than us! The findings will establish priorities and recommendations for creating a safer, more accessible town!

Unfortunately, I believe the traffic situation is only going to get worse. We are just starting to feel the burden of overdevelopment in our area with the increase density from our surrounding towns. These towns are still building their THIRD-round obligations. The impact of high- density housing is not only being felt with traffic but with flooding and increased deer. When open land with trees and vegetation are replaced with impervious coverage, the deer and water have nowhere to go! Allendale has **fully built** its 3rd round through responsible planning but unfortunately, this is not the case for many towns. Imagine what the area will look like when the fourth round needs to be built within the next decade. As a side note... **Allendale has NO obligation to build new housing in the 4th round**. This, again, is due to our proactive approach, excellent strategy and experience in this area.

Thanks to all that came to the **town hall** and answered the survey. I'm very pleased to report that many of you are **happy with the way the Borough is run**. I started the town halls and coffees when I first became mayor and have received tremendous input from everyone. **Our long- and short-term goals are shaped and driven from the feedback we receive, so thank you.**

Please mark your calendars for **two amazing community events this month:**

Tomorrow, September 19 – America's 250th Celebration continues!

Our downtown will be filled with fun and patriotic activities as **the Borough** continues to celebrate America's 250th anniversary with the **Holiday Observers**.

"Main Street" will be closed at 10 am for vehicles. At 11:30 am our downtown will feature fun family activities such as face painting, food, music + more. **The PARADE will kick off at approximately 12:15 starting at Dunkin' Donuts** and will feature floats, horse and carriage, bagpipers, stilt walkers and plenty of surprises!

The parade will lead to **Crestwood Park**, where the **HOLIDAY OBSERVERS** will continue the celebration with reenactments, music, food and lots of family fun **starting at 1pm**.

September 26 – Allendale Day hosted by the Chamber of Commerce!

Join everyone downtown from **12:00–4:00 p.m.** for one of Allendale's favorite traditions... **ALLENDALE DAY!** There are a record number of vendors this year that will feature arts and crafts, face painters, food trucks, unique collectables, music and much much more. And as the sun goes down, the **Holiday Observers Fireworks Show** will commence over Crestwood Lake!

I hope to see you and your families at many of these events. As always, thank you for allowing me the opportunity to serve as your Mayor.

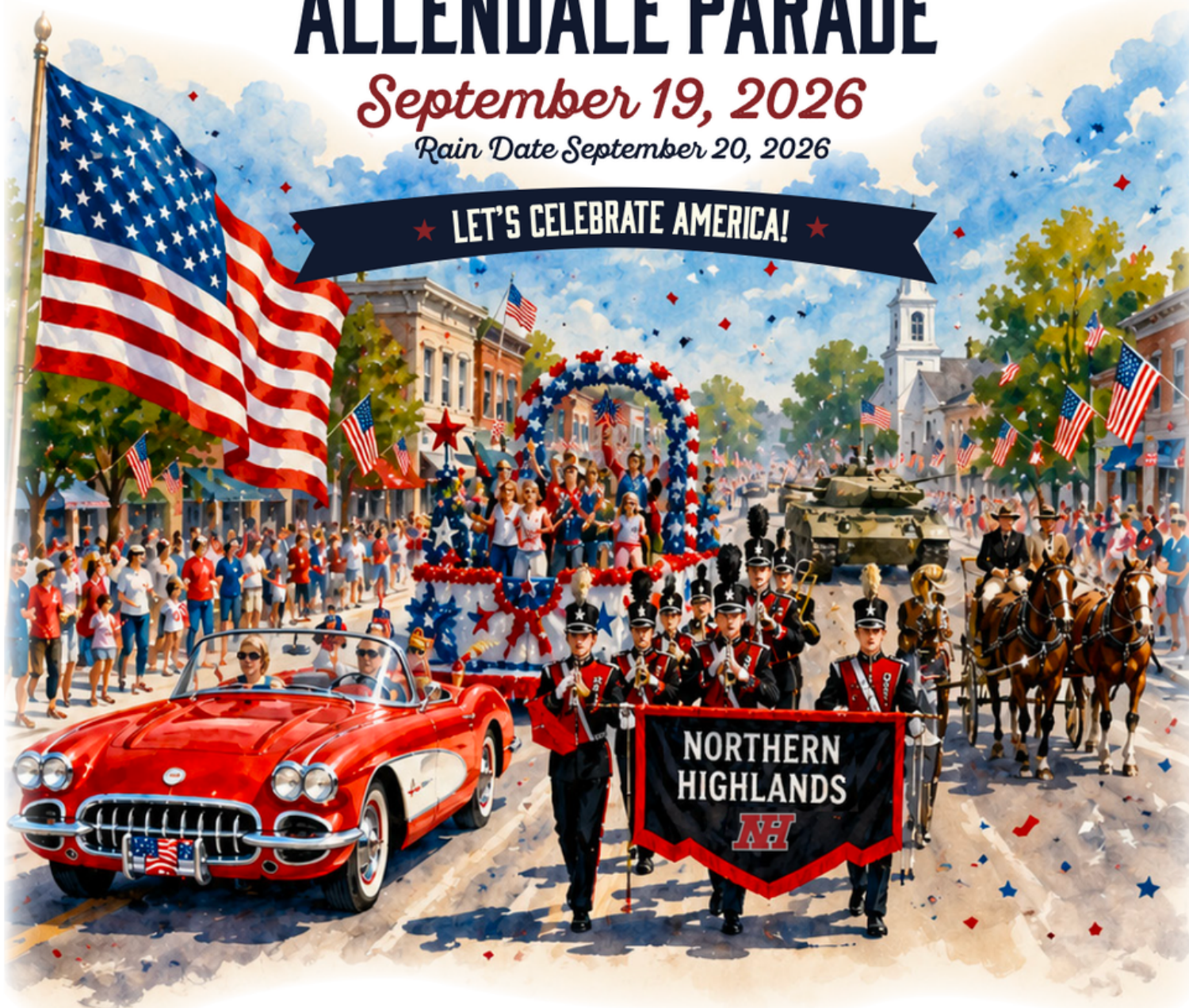

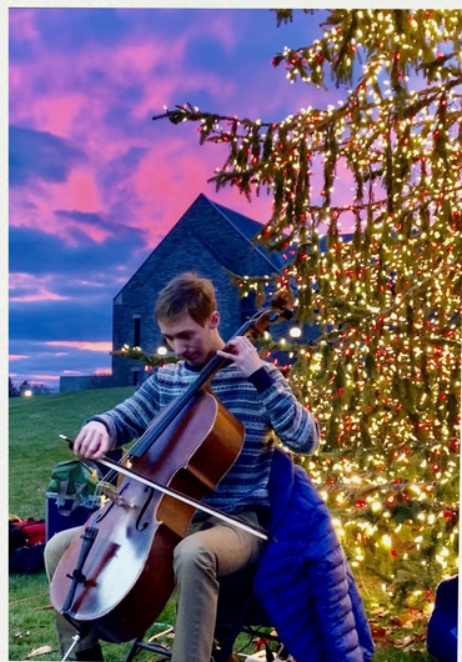
