

RESOLUTION 2026-077

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LINCOLN APPROVING CHANGES TO THE PUBLIC FACILITIES ELEMENT FEE SCHEDULE FOR DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEES

WHEREAS, on June 28, 2022 the City Council of the City of Lincoln adopted Resolution 2022-162, adopting the City of Lincoln Public Facilities Element Fee Program Nexus Study Update, dated June 10, 2022, that produced a comprehensive update to the Public Facilities Fees that were last updated in 2012;

WHEREAS, minor calculation revisions and deletion of some facilities have been made to the City of Lincoln Public Facilities Element Fee Program Nexus Study Update;

WHEREAS, the proposed fees do not exceed the estimated costs required to construct projects to serve new development within our community;

WHEREAS, the City of Lincoln includes the adoption of a capital improvement plan annually as a part of its annual budget that includes Public Facilities Element improvements;

WHEREAS, members of the development community have actively participated in the preparation of the Public Facilities Element Fee Program Nexus Study Update;

WHEREAS, the increase in the Public Facilities Element Fee Schedule has been phased in, with 1/3 increase applied on January 1, 2023, 1/3 increase applied not earlier than July 1, 2024, and 1/3 increase applied not earlier than July 1, 2025;

WHEREAS, annual inflationary adjustments shall be applied 60 days following approval of updated fees each year based on changes to the Engineering News Record – Construction Cost Index between April to April of each year;

WHEREAS, Equivalent Dwelling Unit allocation factors for different use types are identified in the Nexus Study Update and relevant Ordinances;

WHEREAS, the City has published notice of the May 26, 2026 public hearing in the Lincoln News Messenger on May 15, 2026 and on May 22, 2026; and

WHEREAS, enactment of this resolution does not constitute a “Project” as that term is defined under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), CEQA Guidelines Section 16060(c)(2) (the activity will not result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment) and Section 15060(c)(3) (the activity is not a project as defined in Section 15378). Furthermore, the City Council finds that there is no possibility that the adoption of these fees could have a significant effect on the environment, therefore, no

further environmental review is necessary in accordance with CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3).

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

Section 1: The City Council hereby approves the following changes to the Public Facilities Element Fee Schedule for 1.00 Equivalent Dwelling Unit, effective August 1, 2026:

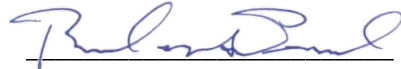
